PSTAP WELLNESS & SAFETY PROTOCOL FOR IN PERSON EVENTS

During these challenging times, PSTAP is committed to helping protect all participants at our live, inperson events.

PSTAP complies with all applicable recommendations and requirements imposed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) as well as all other federal, state, and local health authorities and requires the same of all attendees at our events.

If you are not fully vaccinated, we ask that you wear a mask, in accordance with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and state and local recommendations for the safety and welfare of others as well as yourself. We also strongly encourage any fully vaccinated individual with concerns related to the pandemic to wear a mask. Pursuant to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the <u>Pennsylvania Department of Health</u>, masks are strongly recommended, but not required. While it is our hope that attendees abide by these recommendations, we are unable to guarantee that they will do so and you are attending this event at your own risk. Please note, we will not tolerate belligerent behavior toward our volunteers, staff, other attendees or hotel staff.
